

Outdoor Burn Special Permit Application

This application is for a Special Burn Permit. A special burn permit is for burning that doesn't fit into the agricultural or land clearing burning categories. Agricultural burning includes the burning of orchard trees, open fields, and harvest debris. Land clearing burning means outdoor burning of trees, stumps, shrubbery, or other natural vegetation from land clearing projects. Land clearing projects are projects that clear the land surface so it can be developed, used for a non-agricultural purpose, or left unused. If you plan to conduct land clearing or agricultural burning, please contact the Department of Ecology regional office shown below.

Burning is only one way to dispose of vegetative debris. *Before a burning permit will be issued to you, you must consider alternatives to burning and show that there are no reasonable alternatives.* If, after investigating alternatives, you decide to burn, fill out this application, sign the bottom and mail or fax to your regional Department of Ecology office as listed below.
